



OVERVIEW OF 2018–2019 PILOT PROJECTS

**At least the following
pilot projects will
be operated during the
2018–2019 season:**

- > 5 international education sessions in conjunction to IIHF Championships
- > 5 international MNA-MNA co-operation initiatives
- > 5 club-club exchange initiatives
- > 5 IIHF-MNA assessment, strategy and long-term planning meetings
- > 1 league-league information exchange meeting

Examples of the education sessions include, but are not limited to, coach, recruitment and learn to play and management education.

MNA-MNA co-operation may include initiatives such as educational sessions which can be attended by other countries or on-site visits for information exchange.

Analysis of Progress and Success

- > All assessments, plans and seasonal projects are gathered into one database
- > Based on the agreed goals and objectives, measurable targets and key-performance indicators are defined
- > Measurable targets and KPIs are entered to the database and monitored throughout
- > Final reports, analysis and intelligence are extracted from the database
- > All of these are shared with the respective parties for further planning

CO-OPERATION

GOALS OF CLUB – CLUB CO-OPERATION

1.

To involve the players from Clubs across the Europe. Basically involve the players from smaller Clubs to the practises of bigger Clubs

2.

To involve the coaches from smaller Clubs into practical work in bigger Clubs

3.

To actively send coaches to the smaller Clubs and help to develop new and current coaches in smaller countries

4.

To support and analyse the Exchange Program for coaches, or even players and teams, between EHCA Members (some of those projects are already active)



PILOT PROJECTS OF PPP – CLUB LEVEL IN SEASON 2018–2019

A 6 plus 1 for 7 days – 6 players (incl. one goalie) plus one coach for 7 days (passive)

- > Travel costs covered by the club sending the players (development Clubs)
- > Ground transportation, accommodation, food and beverage costs covered by hosting club (EHCA Member)

B 2–4 Coaches visits for 7 days (passive)



- > Travel costs covered by the club sending the coaches (development Clubs)
- > Ground transportation, accommodation, food and beverage costs covered by hosting club (EHCA Member)

C Traveling coaches for 7 days (active)

- > Sent by EHCA Clubs to the clubs of smaller MNAs
- > Travel costs to destination covered by EHCA Clubs
- > Ground transportation, accommodation, food and beverage costs covered by hosting club
